

Anti Narcotic Policy

Purpose::

The extensive use of narcotics within and outside educational institutions has become a serious concern nowadays. Drug dealers, target students, both as carriers as well as clients. It's high time, for teachers and parents to work against and eradicate this evil force. The highly energetic youth can be guided by educating and at the same time by warning against the adverse effects of narcotics. With this noble intention, we formed anti narcotic cell in our college. We keep close contact with the excise and police departments and arrange programs to make the students aware of the strong legal force working against narcotics and inculcate respect towards parents teachers, and the Indian judiciary. Regular visit in nearby localities and interaction sessions conduct with the outsiders in order to eradicate substantial abuse.

The Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, commonly referred to as the NDPS Act, is an Act of the Parliament of India that prohibits a person the production/manufacturing/cultivation, possession, sale, purchasing, transport, storage, and/or consumption of any narcotic drug or psychotropic substance and in compliance to above, SAL Education Campus is prohibited from any activity which results into violation of above Act and therefore, following policy is resolved by the Campus

Policy::

The Anti Narcotics Policy of SAL Education Campus has been established for curbing drug trafficking and use of illegal substances inside the campus. An effective vigilant committee has been constituted in order

- a) to execute the functions of the cell and also to impart an awareness campaign against use of drugs in the campus.
- b) To ensure a drug- free campus by imposing a total ban on the possession or consumption or use of drugs and alcohol by students of the college, within or outside the campus.

Anti Narcotic Committee:

The duties of the anti-narcotics committee include organizing awareness programmes in the college with the help of government authorized agencies /



organizations. Educating the students about the ill-effects of drugs and alcohol, encouraging peer policing among students against the use of drugs and reporting of any noticed use of drugs by the students are also the duties of the anti-drugs cell.

Procedure/Action:

Records::

A yearly register of offences under the cell will be maintained and all events noted with details. In case of NIL Incidents in the academic year, a NIL statement should be entered therein with signature of at least two of the committee members.
